a. God has a standard on _____ [2 Corinth. 6:14; Amos 3:3; Nehemiah 13:23-27; Psalms 84:11]

"Friends, you need not break Christ's Law in order to find a good husband or a good wife! His rule is that you should not be "unequally yoked together with unbelievers." It is a wise and kind rule and is an assistance rather than a hindrance to a fit marriage. I have never yet met with a single case in which marriages of this kind have been blessed of God. If you break Christ's Law, you cannot expect Christ's blessing. [Spurgeon]

It is a law both of the intellectual and the spiritual nature that by beholding we become changed. The mind gradually adapts itself to the subjects upon which it is allowed to dwell. It becomes assimilated to that which it is accustomed to love and reverence. **[The Great Controversy]**

NOTE: For this reason we should carefully evaluate our mental habits. What we choose to read, hear and watch, whether by book, magazine, radio, television, the internet, or other modern media, shapes and impacts our character. Instead, we should find delight in God's great world of nature and in divine workings. Social dancing is another form of amusement with an evil influence. We must avoid anything that dramatizes, graphically presents, or suggests the sins and crimes of humanity - murder, adultery, robbery and similar evils, which to a large degree are responsible for the breakdown of morality.

c. God has a standard on _____ [Ephesians 5:19; Ezekiel 28:13]

NOTE: Music was made to serve a holy purpose, to lift the thoughts to that which are pure, noble, and elevating and to awaken in the soul, devotion and gratitude to God. On the contrary, debased music breaks down morality and draws us away from our relationship with God. We should exercise great care in the choice of music in our homes, social gatherings, schools and churches. Any melody

partaking of the nature of jazz, rock, or related hybrid forms, or any language expressing foolish or trivial sentiments, should be shunned.

d. God has a standard on _____ [2 Timothy 2:9; 2 Corinthians 3:18]

Webster defines immodesty as "arousing or tending to arouse sexual desire or interest." It defines modest as "not offensive to sexual mores in conduct or appearance." The world revels in sexiness, but among Christians "there must not be even a hint of sexual immorality, or of any kind of impurity, because these are improper for God's holy people."

But it is marvelous, while many are taking all the trouble they can to array this poor body, they have very few ornaments for their soul; they forgot to dress the soul, the children of God cannot now be told by outward appearance from the children of the devil. Some will say, "I wish you would leave that alone!" Of course you do, because it applies to yourself. But we let nothing alone which we believe to be in the Scriptures; and while I would not spare any man's soul honesty to every man's conscience and honesty to myself demands, that I should always speak of that which I see to be an evil breaking out in the Church. These are the ornaments which angels themselves admire, and which even the word will admire; for men must give admiration to the man or the woman who is arrayed in the jewels of a holy life and godly conversation. I beseech you, brethren, "adorn the doctrine of God our Savior in all things."
