23 LAST DAY SIGNS

The last days are to be characterized by great:

1. _____ injustice and social _____ [James 5:1-7]

NOTE: Since the turn of the century we have seen mounting tension between capital and labor. Almost daily we read accounts of new strikes. Many are amassing wealth while millions are starving to death.

Since the dispute between management and labor will not end until Jesus comes, the Christian is urged to be patient until that time (verse 8.) At the same time anarchy is seeking to sweep away all law, not only divine, but human. The centralizing of wealth and power; the vast combinations for the enriching of the few at the expense of the many; the combinations of the poorer classes for the defense of their interests and claims; the spirit of unrest, of riot and bloodshed; the world-wide dissemination of the same teachings that led to the French Revolution--all are tending to involve the whole world in a struggle similar to that which convulsed France. **[Education, 228]**

The world, full of rioting, full of godless pleasure, is asleep, asleep in carnal security. Men are putting afar off the coming of the Lord. They laugh at warnings. The proud boast is made, "All things continue as they were from the beginning." "Tomorrow shall be as this day, and much more abundant." [2 Peter 3:4; Isaiah 56:12] We will go deeper into pleasure loving. But Christ says, "Behold, I come as a thief." [Revelation 16:15] At the very time when the world is asking in scorn, "Where is the promise of His coming?" the signs are fulfilling. While they cry, "Peace and safety," sudden destruction is coming. When the scorner, the rejecter of truth, has become presumptuous; when the routine of work in the various money-making lines is carried on without regard to principle; when the student is eagerly seeking knowledge of everything but his Bible, Christ comes as a thief. [The Desire of Ages, 635]

8. Religious _____ [Luke 18:8]

Religious skepticism sometimes has to do with the practitioners of religion. Sadly, some religious people are immoral, dishonest, or just plain mean. Some skeptics have had bad experiences with religion in the past. According to the Barna Group, the biggest reason religious skepticism has grown among Millennials (those born between 1985 and 2002) rests on personal interactions with "Christians" who were truly un-Christian. Religious hypocrisy has left many disillusioned and disengaged from the faith that once solidified the Western world.

9. Intemperance and physical degeneracy.
10. Falling from truth. [2 Timothy 4:1-4; Isaiah 30:8-10]

A high salary is paid for a talented minister to entertain and attract the people. His sermons must not touch popular sins, but be made smooth and pleasing for fashionable ears. Thus fashionable sinners are enrolled on the church records, and fashionable sins are concealed under a pretense of godliness. [GC 386.1]

Today there is need of the voice of stern rebuke; for grievous sins have separated the people from God. Infidelity is fast becoming fashionable. "We will not have this man to reign over us," is the language of thousands. Luke 19:14. The smooth sermons so often preached make no lasting impression; the trumpet

does not give a certain sound. Men are not cut to the heart by the plain, sharp truths of God's word. [PK 140.2]

11. _____ degeneracy.

[Luke 17:28; Romans 1:26]

The flames that consumed the cities of the plain shed their warning light down even to our time. We are taught the fearful and solemn lesson that while God's mercy bears long with the transgressor, there is a limit beyond which men may not go on in sin. When that limit is reached, then the offers of mercy are withdrawn and the ministration of judgment begins. **[Patriarchs and Prophets, 162]**

False religious leaders are alive and well today, gaining influence not only in the church but also out in the world at large. Some have been written about in popular magazines and major newspapers, being hailed as the new generation of Christian leaders whom the world can work with. They are well spoken of by the

cultural elite. According to news.com.au, at least six other men have claimed to be Jesus Christ reincarnated in the last decade.

It means exactly what Jesus said in **Matthew 24:33**, "When you see all these things know that it is near, even at the door."

NOTE: Jesus and the apostles exhort us to actively "watch!" We need to understand all that they meant and the wide-ranging implications. Our survival and salvation could depend on that understanding and action. To watch in the sense here used, is more than merely being awake. It means to be alert, to scan eagerly, to observe in order to look after, to protect or guard. The admonition to "watch" has many applications:
